

The **6th edition of the Mobile Learning (ML) International Conference** was hosted in Porto, Portugal, during **19 to 21 March, 2010**.

This ML Conference seeks to provide a forum for the discussion and presentation of mobile learning research which provides a retrospective outlook of the field. We seek contributions under the following topics which illustrate developments in the field. In particular, but not exclusively, we aim to explore the transition from content consumer to content creator in experiences that take advantage of the learning opportunities this provides.

Topics: Pedagogical approaches and theories for mLearning, mLearning in formal educational institutions, Integrating mLearning with broader educational scenarios, Informal and lifelong mLearning, Learner mobility & transitions across physical, conceptual, social space and technologies, User Studies in mLearning, Mobile social media & user generated content, Enabling mLearning technologies, applications & uses, Evaluation and evaluation methodologies for mLearning, Tools, technologies and platforms for mLearning, Mobile Web 2.0 applications for mLearning and Mobile game-based learning.



The Mobile Learning 2010 Conference had 128 submissions from more than 38 countries. Each submission has been anonymously reviewed by an average of five independent reviewers, to guarantee the final high standard of the accepted submissions. Out of the papers submitted, 25 received blind referee ratings that signified acceptability for publication as full papers (acceptance rate below 20%), while some others were published as short papers, reflection papers, posters and doctoral papers.

The Conference Program featured an opening and closing sessions, 14 parallel paper sessions, 2 Keynote Presentations, 1 Doctoral Consortium Presentation, a Poster Session and a Panel.
